You must give a definite starting and ending point of the route you plan to clean, the number of adults and children participating, and the location you will leave filled bags. This information is necessary to have the materials (garbage bags, gloves, and safety vests) ordered in time.

The official cleanup day is Saturday, April 21, but you may pick up litter and leave your bags any day during that week. Anyone who cleans up after April 21 must make their own arrangements for bag pick up with PennDOT.

Please be aware that many routes are regularly picked up by certain organizations. If you plan to be involved for the first time it would be a good idea to choose a route that you notice is not typically picked up by anyone else.

In addition, Pastor Kaufman is the hosting Dean of the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Mission District. She is also co-chair of the Usher Team and is in need of volunteers (i.e. ushers, greeters, etc.) Those who take part in the assembly as a volunteer are not charged a fee to attend.
